### **Editorial Policy**

*Administration* was founded in 1953 to encourage research and promote debate on public management, public administration and public policy in Ireland. These remain the objectives of the journal. The journal is produced by the Institute of Public Administration but draws on the support of an international Editorial Advisory Committee.

*Administration* has a wide-ranging audience, including both scholars and practitioners. We welcome contributions in a number of guises, as outlined below. We also welcome suggestions in respect of special editions and collaborations in respect of the publication of conference proceedings, if deemed appropriate to the journal's objectives. Acceptance of an article in *Administration* is on the understanding that it has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere. **Research articles:** Full research articles are expected to adhere to high-quality research standards. Research topics encompass a broad domain, ranging from theoretical and empirical research to policy analyses and evaluation research. All research articles are double-blind, peer-reviewed. The typical length of research articles is between 5,000 and 8,000 words.

**Forum:** The forum section is a vehicle for elected officials and public administrators to share their experience and insights in respect of important issues on the public administration agenda. Other comment and opinion pieces may also be considered for this section. Articles are accepted at the editor's discretion and an informal review process may take place. Where relevant, authors' views should be supported by evidence grounded in their knowledge, experience and insights. Forum pieces are typically 2,000–5,000 words.

**Book reviews:** The reviews section discusses books that address critical issues in public management, public administration and public policy. We welcome unsolicited book reviews and also indications of availability from potential reviewers. Reviews are typically 1,500 words.

**Special editions and symposiums:** We welcome suggestions with regard to special editions, which are guest edited, and symposiums that encompass presentations drawn from conferences of interest to our readership.
