JOURNAL SCOPE

Endocrine Regulations (from 1967 to 1990 as *Endocrinologia Experimentalis*), an open access, peer reviewed international journal, welcomes the submission of original research papers and review articles from traditionally recognized fields of experimental and clinical endocrinology, including neuroendocrinology, thyroid and adrenal gland research, metabolism and diabetes, reproduction, and genetic endocrinology. Basic and pathophysiological studies using animal models, and research studies at cellular and molecular level are also considered, as well as human sample studies, where this is the experimental model of choice. Clinical case reports are also welcome.

INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS

Type of Paper

1. Original Research Articles (Original Studies)
2. Case Reports
3. Rapid Communications
4. Review Articles (Reviews)
5. Special Issues (Special Issue Articles)

Original Research Articles (Original Studies) are considered for publication if they describe significant, new, and carefully confirmed findings supported with adequate experimental data. The manuscript should be divided as follows: Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, References. Figures and Tables should not exceed ten items.

Case Reports are considered for publication if they describe new and carefully confirmed clinical findings. The manuscript preparation should follow the structure of *Original Research Articles*.

Short Communications are manuscripts containing new clinical and experimental data of less extent. They should not exceed 3 printed pages and may include 1 Table and 1 Figure. The list of references at the end of the paper should not exceed 10 citations. The manuscript preparation should follow the structure of *Original Research Articles*, however, Results and Discussion need to be joined in one section.

Review Articles should fit within the scope for the journal. Review Articles of high quality or developed by conducting a systematic research review including of those from meta-analyses are acceptable. Review Articles should be no longer than 10,000 words and contain no more than eight Figures and Tables. Illustrations explaining the mechanisms referred to the review are strongly encouraged.

Special Issues. The journal welcomes proposals for special issues on topics that fall within the scope of the journal. The proposal should identify prospective papers and authors and give an indication of the time-scale, in which the special issue could be produced.

Article Structure

Authors should follow the following outline:

Title page, not included in the manuscript volume, should contain:

- a) Short Title (limit: 8 words);
- b) Title;
- c) Full names of the authors (no titles or academic grades);
- d) Affiliations of the authors (Department/Laboratory, Faculty/Institute, University/Research Center, Town, Country);
- e) Corresponding author information: full name, academic titles, affiliation, complete mailing address, phone number, and e-mail address.

Manuscript should be organized in the following order:

Page 1 should contain:

- a) Abstract containing no more than 250 words, subdividing into the following sections: Objective(s), Methods, Results, and Conclusions;
- b) Keywords (limit: 8 words).

Next pages should contain:

- a) Introduction, indicating also the aim of the study;
- b) Materials and Methods (including Informed Consent, Human and Animal Rights or Ethical Compliance);
- c) Results (double presentation of data in the form of text, tables or figures should be avoided);
- d) Discussion;
- e) Acknowledgements (including funding);
- f) Conflict of interest;
- g) List of References;
- h) Figure Legends;
- i) Tables (if are provided with the Main text file).

References style

Text: All citations in the text should refer to:

1. Single author: the author's name, without initials, and the year of publication (Kiss 2000);
2. Two authors: both authors' names and the year of publication (Kiss and Jones 2000);
3. Three or more authors: first author's name followed by "et al." and the year of publication (Kiss et al. 2000).

Citations may be made directly or parenthetically. Groups of references should be listed chronologically.

List: References should be arranged alphabetically and then further sorted chronologically, if necessary. More papers from the same author(s) in the same year must be identified by the a, b, c etc. letters placed after the year of publication.

Language

The manuscript should be written in good English (American or British, but not their mixture is accepted).

Artwork

Electronic artwork

When your electronic artwork is finalized, save and submit it in JPG or TIFF formats. For color or grayscale photographs (halftones), a minimum of 300 dpi should be used.

Figure captions

Each illustration should have a caption. Captions should be supplied separately. The text of the illustrations should have a minimum description. All the symbols and abbreviations should be clearly explained.

Tables

Please, submit tables as editable text and not as an image. The tables should be numbered consecutively in accordance with their appearance in the text. The data presented in tables should not be duplicated in the results or described again elsewhere in the article. All the symbols and abbreviations should be clearly explained.

Submission

Manuscripts should be submitted via Editorial Manager system:

The online submission system guides you stepwise through the process of entering your article details and uploading your files. The system converts your files to a single PDF

file used in the peer-review process. Editable files (e.g. Word) are required to typeset your article for final publication. All correspondence, including notification of the Editor's decision and requests for revision, will be sent by e-mail.

Authors will be asked to submit a proposal of four foreign Referees with their full names and e-mail addresses.

Submission checklist

All necessary files have been uploaded:

- Title page (with title and all authors)
- Manuscript (without a title page)
- All figures (JPG or TIF format)
- All tables (Word format)
- Conflict of Interest (PDF format)
- Open Access License (PDF format)

Further considerations:

- Manuscript has been "spell and grammar checked"
- All references mentioned in the Reference List are cited in the text, and vice versa
- Permission has been obtained for use of copyrighted material from other sources (including the Internet)
- Referee suggestions and contact details provided, based on journal requirements.
