

## Editorial Policy

### Focus and Scope:

The European Review of Applied Sociology (ERAS) is a peer-reviewed academic journal that aims to encourage and publish high-quality research in the fields of applied sociology, both qualitative and quantitative. The journal seeks to foster a better understanding of the social, economic, and cultural phenomena that shape our world and to contribute to the development of evidence-based policies and practices.

### Peer Review Process:

ERAS uses a rigorous double-blind peer-review process, in which the identities of both authors and reviewers are kept confidential. The editorial team first assesses all submitted manuscripts to ensure that they meet the journal's scope and standards. The manuscripts that meet the initial criteria are then sent to at least two independent referees who are experts in the relevant field. The referees provide detailed feedback on the quality, relevance, and originality of the manuscript and suggest revisions or improvements where necessary. Based on the feedback of the referees, the editorial team makes a decision on the publication of the manuscript. The possible outcomes of the review process include acceptance without revision, acceptance with mandatory revisions, or rejection.

### Plagiarism Policy:

ERAS has a strict policy on plagiarism and considers it a serious ethical offense. All submitted manuscripts are checked for plagiarism, including self-plagiarism, using plagiarism detection software. Manuscripts containing plagiarized content or any form of dishonesty will be immediately rejected, and the authors will be notified of the decision.

### Publication Frequency:

ERAS publishes two issues per year, in May and October.

ERAS is committed to the principles of open access and believes that making research freely available to the public enhances the global exchange of knowledge. Therefore, all content published in ERAS is immediately and permanently accessible to anyone, anywhere in the world, free of charge.
